**Wildsight Golden Rocky Mountain Bighorn Sheep Project Study Area:
Kicking Horse Canyon, east of Golden, BC.
620 hectares**







Stop sheep from accessing the highway corridor

eliminate attractants by removing spilled grains,
not planting alfalfa and not fencing animals out of critical ranges

DONE!

ensure alternative sources of required minerals, food and
level to slightly sloping east-west travel routes

NEEDS
WORK

change existing fencing to allow access to open SW facing slopes

UNLIKELY

alter one-way gates and jump-outs to impede two-way use

DONE!

ensure Phase 4 highway development connects currently
used habitat north and south of the TransCanada #1

DONE!







Improve habitat quality away from the highway

cultivate highly digestible and high-protein trees, shrubs, forbs and grasses

ensure access to required minerals

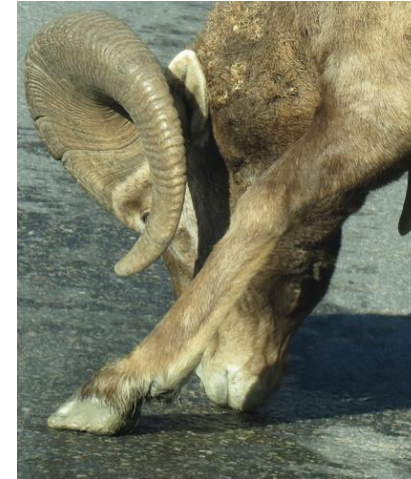
remove invasive weeds and their seeds
